# Swazi National Treasury Act, 1950 Act 81 of 1950

#### Commenced on 1 January 1951

An Act to make provision for the establishment and constitution of a Swazi National Treasury.

#### 1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Swazi National Treasury Act, 1950.

#### 2. Interpretation

In this Act unless the context otherwise requires—

"Minister" means the Minister for Finance;

"Treasury" means the Swazi National Treasury established by section 3.

#### 3. Establishment of Swazi National Treasury

There shall be established a Treasury to be called the Swazi National Treasury.

#### 4. Minister's powers to make regulations

The Minister may, by notice in the Gazette, make regulations providing for—

- (a) accounting procedure and the auditing of accounts;
- (b) the submission of annual estimates, accounts and reports.

## 5. Ngwenyama in Libandhla may make regulations

The Ngwenyama in Libandla may, with the prior approval of the Minister, make regulations providing for—

- (a) the constitution, conduct and management of the Treasury;
- (b) the appointment, removal and tenure of office of the officers of the Treasury;
- (c) the purpose to which the funds of the Treasury shall be devoted,

and generally for the better administration of the Treasury.

#### 6. Offences against regulations

Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any regulation made under <u>section 5</u> shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred emalangeni or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to such lesser punishment as may be prescribed by such regulations.
