THE UMBUTFO SWAZILAND DEFENCE FORCE ORDER 1977

(No. 10 of 1977)

**APPOINTMENT OF MAJOR-GENERAL TO THE UMBUTFO
SWAZILAND DEFENCE FORCE**

(Under section 13)

(Commencement: 22nd July, 1978)

In exercise of my powers under the above-mentioned Order, I, SOBHUZA II, King of Swaziland, and by virtue of the authority vested in me as the Ngwenyama of the Swazi Nation, do hereby appoint —

to the rank of MAJOR GENERAL to the Umutfo Swaziland Defence Force with immediate effect.

THE GOVERNMENT LANDS DISPOSAL PROCLAMATION

(Cap. 134)

THE SITEKI TOWNSHIP EXTENSION NO. 1 REGULATIONS, 1978

(Under Section 12)

(Commencement: 4th. August, 1978)

The Honourable Acting Minister for Local Administration is hereby pleased to make the following regulations:—

Citation.

1. The regulations may be cited as the Siteki Township Extension No. 1, Regulations, 1978.

Establishment of Township and alteration of general plan.

2. (1) Certain Farm No. 1247 in extent 55,7749 (Fifty Five comma Seven Seven Four Nine) hectares situate in the Lubombo District held by the Crown under Certificate of Registered Title No.93 of 1978 dated 14th April, 1978 with diagram No.125/75 annexed thereto, comprising 56 (Fifty six) lots numbered 186-241 inclusive and roads, as will more fully appear from the General Plan S.G. No.S.126/75 approved by the Surveyor-General for Swaziland on the 17th August, 1977.

(2) The Surveyor-General shall alter the General Plan so as to indicate the name and lot numbers assigned by these regulations to the Crown and shall endorse the General Plan of Siteki Township and General Plan S.G. No.S.126/75 accordingly:

(3) The Registrar of Deeds shall:—

(a) Make the necessary endorsement on the relevant title deeds:
and

(b) Open the necessary register in connection with the town.

Applicability of Cap. 79.

3. The provisions of sections 3 to 12 inclusive of the Siteki Township Proclamation and of the regulations made thereunder shall apply to the Town established by these regulations.

THE COTTON ACT, 1967

(No. 26 of 1967)

THE COTTON (COTTON DESTRUCTION AND PLANTING DATES)
REGULATIONS 1978

(Under Sections 10 and 17)

(Commencement: 31st August 1978)

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by the abovementioned Act, the Honourable the Minister for Agriculture, after consultation with the Cotton Board, is pleased to make the following Regulations:

Citation.

1. These regulations may be cited as the cotton (Cotton Destruction and Planting Dates) Regulations 1978.

Dates before which cotton plants to be destroyed.

2. The 31st day of August 1978 is the date for the whole of Swaziland before which all cotton plants shall be destroyed.

Method of destruction.

3. The method of destruction to be followed by the growers for their cotton plants in terms of regulation 2 are:—

- (a) The removal of the upper portion of the plant severing it at a point at least two inches below the surface of the ground and the burning of the portion so removed,
or,
- (b) by means of an agricultural implement, so lacerating and burning the plant as to prevent its re-growth.

Default in Destruction.

4. (1) The Owner of the land on which is grown a cotton plant to be destroyed as required by regulations 2 and 3 shall ensure that the grower complies with those regulations.

(2) If a grower or an owner fails to comply with regulations 2 and 3, the Permanent Secretary or the Board may cause the cotton plant to be destroyed and recover from the owner the expense of the destruction.

Date before which cotton not to be planted.

5. The 15th October, 1978 is the date for the whole of Swaziland before which no cotton shall be planted.

Penalties.

6. If a grower or owner :—

- (a) fails, as required by regulations 2 and 3, to destroy a cotton plant; or,
- (b) plant cotton in contravention of regulation 5.

He shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred Emalangeni; or imprisonment for a period not exceeding three months.
