THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE AND EVIDENCE (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1988

(Bill 11 of 1988)

(To be presented by the Minister for Justice)

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to amend the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act, 1938 in the following respects:

- (a) by increasing the penalties under section 38;
- (b) by adding a new section which makes it an offence to harbour, conceal or assist a person wanted in connection with the commission of an offence.

A BILL entitled

An Act to amend the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act, 1938. ENACTED by the King and the Parliament of Swaziland.

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Criminal Procedure and Evidence (Amendment) Act, 1988 and shall be read as one with the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act, 1938.

Amendment of section 38.

2. Section 38 of the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act, 1938 is amended in subsection (2) by replacing the words "forty rand" and "one month" with the words "one thousand Emalangeni" and twelve months" respectively.

Addition of section 43 bis.

- 3. The Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act, 1938 is amended by inserting after section 43 the following new section—
 - "Penalty for harbouring, concealing, etc.
 - 43 bis. A person who-
 - (a) harbours, conceals or assists in any manner whatsoever in harbouring or concealing any person whom he knows or has reason to believe has committed an offence or is sought by the Police in connection with the commission by that person of an offence; or
 - (b) knowing the whereabouts of any person whom he knows or has reason to believe has committed an offence or is sought by the Police in connection with the commission by that person of an offence, fails to report such whereabouts within reasonable time to a Police officer or to the nearest police station

THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE PARLIAMENT OF SWAZILAND (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1988

(Bill No. 12 of 1988)

(To be presented by the Prime Minister) MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Establishment of the Parliament of Swaziland Order, 1978 so as to modify the legislative process by extending the period within which the King shall assent or withhold assent to a Bill presented to him after it has been passed by Parliament.

A BILL entitled

An Act to amend the Establishment of the Parliament of Swaziland Order, 1978. ENACTED by the King and the Parliament of Swaziland.

Short title and commencement.

1. This Act may be cited as the Establishment of the Parliament of Swaziland (Amendment) Act, 1988, shall be read as one with the Establishment of the Parliament of Swaziland Order, 1978 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 12th October, 1978.

Amendment of section 60.

2. Section 60 of the Establishment of the Parliament of Swaziland Order, 1978 is amended in subsection (2)(b) by replacing the words "thirty days" with the words "sixty days".

Validation of certain Bills and Acts.

3. All Bills to which the provisions of the Order amended by section 2 applied before the commencement of this Act and all corresponding Acts relating to such Bills shall, to all intents and purposes, be valid as if those provisions had been complied with.
