LEGAL NOTICE NO. 42 OF 1989

THE COTTON ACT, 1967

(Act No. 26 of 1967)

THE COTTON LEVY NOTICE, 1989

(Under Section 13)

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 13 of the Cotton Act, 1967 (hereinafter called "the principal Act") the Minister for Agriculture and Co-operatives, after consulting the Cotton Board, hereby issues the following Notice—

Citation.

1. This Notice may be cited as the Cotton Levy Notice, 1989.

Imposition of Levy 1988/89.

2. A levy of 0.5 of one cent per kilogram of seed cotton produced by a grower in respect of the 1988/89 season is imposed.

Date before which payment to be made.

3. The Levy imposed by paragraph 2 shall be paid before 1st December, 1989.

Method of payment.

- 4. The grower shall pay the levy under paragraph 2 and surcharge of it under section 13(b) of the principal Act to the following who have agreed with the Cotton Board to deduct the levy from the purchase price of seed cotton purchased and to pay the amount to the Executive Officer in accordance with section 13(7) of the principal Act, namely—
 - (i) Swaziland Cotona Ginning Company (Pty) Limited;
 - (ii) J.C. Clark Cotton Company (Pty) Limited;
 - (iii) Matsanjeni Farmers Co-operative Society.

Recovery of levy.

5. The Board may recover from a ginner an unpaid levy and surcharge under section 13 of the principal Act.

Revocation of Legal Notice No. 36 of 1988.

6. The Cotton Levy Notice, 1988 is hereby revoked.

LEGAL NOTICE NO. 43 OF 1989

THE COTTON ACT, 1967

(Act No. 26 of 1967)

THE COTTON HARVESTING, PACKING AND BALING REGULATIONS, 1989

(Under Section 17)

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 17 of the Cotton Act, 1967 the Minister for Agriculture and Co-operatives, after consultation with the Cotton Board, hereby makes the following Regulations—

Citation and commencement.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Cotton Harvesting, Packing and Baling Regulations, 1989 and shall come into force on 8th May, 1989.

Restriction on harvesting.

2. No cotton grower shall use woven polypropylene bags or any form of polypropylene bags for picking cotton.

Restriction of packing.

- (a) No cotton grower shall pack seed cotton into any woolpack other than Jute woolpack;
 - (b) No cotton grower shall use for sewing woolpacks any twine other than a prescribed cotton twine:
 - (c) No cotton buyer shall supply to the cotton grower woolpacks or receive from cotton growers cotton packed in woolpacks other than Jute woolpacks;
 - (d) No cotton buyer shall supply to the growers any twine or receive from cotton growers woolpacks sewn in any twine other than a prescribed cotton twine.

Restriction on wrapping bales.

4. No cotton ginnery shall use any material for wrapping Lint bales other than a prescribed poly-ethylene film or cotton cloth.

Penalties.

- 5. (1) Any person who contravenes the provisions of regulations 2, 3 and 4 shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding E100 or to imprisonment for a period of three month or to both such fine and imprisonment.
- (2) In addition to the penalty stipulated in sub-regulation (1) any cotton that is suspected of being contaminated as a result of the infringement of the above regulations will be impounded and if proved to be contaminated destroyed.
