



LEGAL NOTICE NO. 22 OF 1981

THE POSTS AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS ACT, 1962

(ACT NO. 60 OF 1962)

THE TELEPHONE (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1981

(UNDER SECTION 105)

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 105 of the Posts and Telecommunications Act, 1962, the Minister for Works, Power and Communications hereby makes the following Regulations:-

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Telephone (Amendment) Regulations, 1981, shall be read as one with the Telephone Regulations, 1962 and shall come into force on the 1st April, 1981.

Amendment of Part III

2. Part III of the Telephone Regulations, 1962 is amended by replacing Regulations 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 with the following:-

(2) The Director may, in his discretion, have terminated a call after the expiration of three minutes.

Supplementary Trunk Service Charges

7.

(a) Fixed time calls — Arrangements may be made in advance for trunk communication with a given number to be effected at a specified time. The transaction is at caller's risk, and if the callee does not respond, the prescribed fee will, nevertheless, be charged. The charges shall be as follows:-

ordinary trunk service charge plus 50% of the charge applicable to a 3 minute period of the call.

- (b) Personal Calls When making application for a trunk call to a subscriber's telephone, the caller may request that a particular person should be called to the telephone, by the subscriber, for the call. The fee for the transmission of the message of advice to the distant telephone subscriber will be 50% of the charge applicable to a 3 minute period of the call.
- (c) Advice of Duration and Charge When making application for a trunk call to a subscriber's telephone, the caller may request to be advised of the duration and charges on completion of the call. The fee for the advice of the duration and charges shall be 30 cents.
- (d) Collect Calls When making arrangements for a trunk call, the caller may request that the charges for the call are accepted by the callee. If the callee accepts to be billed for the call, the charges shall be as follows: ordinary trunk service charge plus 50% of the charge applicable to a 3 minute period of the call.
- (e) Alarm Calls Arrangements may be made in advance for a subscriber to receive an alarm call at a specified time. The fee for an alarm call shall be 30 cents."
