LEGAL NOTICE NO. 98 OF 1995

THE PUBLIC ORDER ACT, 1963

(Act No.17 of 1963)

THE DESIGNATION OF THE SWAZILAND FEDERATION OF TRADE UNIONS MASS STAY AWAY AS A BOYCOTT, NOTICE, 1995

(UNDER SECTION 13)

In Exercise of the powers conferred upon me under section 13 of the Public Order, Act, 1963, I PRINCE MBILINI PRIME MINISTER OF THE KINGDOM OF SWAZILAND hereby designate the mass stay away called by the Swaziland Federation of Trade Unions to start on the 17th July, 1995 or any date thereafter, to be a **Boycott** as it has the effect of -

- bringing into hatred or contempt, exciting disaffention against or undermining the lawful authority of Swaziland Government;
- (b) endangering public Order; and
- (c) endangering the economic life of Swaziland.

Further, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me under the said section 13, I hereby specify in relation to the designated **Boycott** the following actions to be likely to further such **Boycott** -

- the unlawful withdrawal of employees services from their employers including essential services as defined under the Employment Act, 1980;
- the unlawful interference with and public disruption of public transport operations;
- the unlawful interference with members of the public in their normal business and operations;
- (d) the unlawful interference with the life and property of members of the public and the state;
- the unlawful interference with and disruption of normal business operations;
- (f) the unlawful interference and disruption of the educational system;
- (g) the unlawful interference with any person doing any act which may lawfully be done or any person omitting to do anything which may lawfully be omitted to be done.

This Notice shall operate with immediate effect until further notice.
